sacrifices of those who have stepped forward to protect the cause of freedom Members of the United States Armed Services, intelligence agencies, diplomatic service, homeland security, law enforcement personnel and first responders, and their families, have given so much to protect our freedom and defend

WHEREAS, because of those sacrifices, September 11th will never, and should never be just another day in the

hearts and minds of all people of the United States.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Gaston County Board of Commissioners recognizes the 24th

Anniversary and commemorates the lives of those lost and injured in the attacks of

and honors their loved ones for their courage and faithfulness to endure and carry on. The Board further salutes the heroes that placed themselves in harm's way on that fateful day, and the sacrifices of those who served, and continue to serve, to keep us safe at home and abroad, as we stand together, united and steadfast as a nation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Gaston County Board of Commissioners recognizes September 11<sup>th</sup> as "First Responder Day", an annual legal holiday as established by the North Carolina General Assembly as part of the 2017 Appropriations Act (HB 257)

In 2017 the NC General Assembly designated September 11<sup>th</sup> of each year as First Responder Day, making it an official state holiday pursuant to G.S 103-4(a)(10a) The date of September 11<sup>th</sup> was chosen in recognition of the sacrifices made by first responders at the World Trade Center attack in New York.
