

- WHEREAS President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, declaring the slaves in Confederate territory free, paving the way for the passing of the 13th Amendment which formally abolished slavery in the United States of America; and,
- WHEREAS. word about the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation was delayed some two and one half years, to June 19, 1865, in reaching authorities and African-Americans in the Southern United States; and,
- the celebration of the end of slavery, which became known as Juneteenth, is the oldest WHEREAS. known public celebration of the end of slavery in the United States and has been celebrated by the African-American community for over 150 years; and,
- WHEREAS, Juneteenth commemorates African-American freedom and celebrates the successes gained through education and greater success and reminds each of us of the precious promises of freedom, equality, and opportunity which are at the core of the American Dream: and,
- the first Juneteenth celebration was a time for reassurance, prayer, and the gathering of WHEREAS, family members and neighbors, and today, it is a time of remembrance and celebration within communities throughout the country to promote and cultivate knowledge and appreciation of African American history and culture, while encouraging continuous selfdevelopment and respect for all people and cultures; and,
- WHEREAS. Gaston County is proud to celebrate this historic day for the fourth time and is excited to join the Sixth Annual Juneteenth celebration on Saturday, June 15, 2024 at Juneteenth Health Fair at Highland Health Center, 609 N. Highland Street - 10 am; at the Juneteenth Parade in downtown Gastonia - 3 p.m.; and the Gastonia EbonyFest Juneteenth Festival at the Rotary Pavilion in downtown Gastonia - 4 p.m. Wednesday, June 19, 2024: Gastonia EbonyFest Juneteenth Festival at 6 p.m., with vendors, food, speeches and fireworks at the Rotary Pavilion.
