List Specifics of Purchase

The East Gaston VFD is requested \$9,000.00 from the fund balance to cover the cost for replacing the tires on Tanker 30. The tires on this apparatus have reached the end of the NFPA service life and must be replaced, should an accident occur and these tires are not within compliance the department would bare the full burden and this would deny families any line of duty benefits. This singular purchase would require the department to exceed their current vehicle maintenance line item and would account for a third of the overall budget line in future years. The department did apply for the state grant for tires but ultimately was denied the grant, as well the department has sent a letter to Michelin seeking a donation to cover the replacement or a portion of the replacement.

Subject: Capital Improvement Plan / 5 Year Plan

The Board of Directors for the East Gaston Volunteer Fire Department have done a thorough review of the department's needs and with that have identified several items that will require Capital Funding. The department currently has debt service for a consolidated Fire Station & Apparatus Loan that will be paid in full March of 2026. The East Gaston Volunteer Fire Department seeks to earmark those funds for future purchases as outlined below.

- Replacement of Engine 30 – Engine 30 a 2008 Spartan Smeal and will reach 20 – year service life in 2028. With future planning in mind and rising maintenance costs across the fleet the department is currently seeking replacement options. Primarily the department is in the developmental stage for a certificate of need to purchase a replacement apparatus that is due to be completed in the summer of 2026. With this purchase the current Engine 30 would move to a reserve apparatus and Rescue 30 – a 2000 Freightliner FL70 dry rescue will be sold.
- Replacement of Squad 30 – The East Gaston Volunteer Fire Department has established an apparatus committee to begin the development and design for a replacement apparatus. The current Squad 30 is a 2009 Spartan Smeal which will reach its 20-year service life in 2029. With the process beginning now and the estimated 3-year production time for a new apparatus, the department intends to proceed with this acquisition within the next 6 months to 1-year.
- Tanker 30 will also reach its 20-year service life in 2029; this project is slated for future development based upon the needs of the department.
- HVAC replacement, the department is looking to implement a systematic replacement of HVAC systems at the fire station. The fire station will be 20-years old in 2027, this is well beyond the life span of the 5 systems that support the facility, one such unit has already been partially replaced due to failure. Due to the significance and depth of this project it will likely be a costly replacement within the next 1-3 years. The department intends to space this replacement process out after the payoff of the current loan.
- Bay door replacement – The current glass bay doors are experiencing structural design issues. The doors are beginning to bow, some more significantly than others. Door maintenance personnel have explained that this issue is due to the design of the door. The department will need to replace these almost 20-year-old doors in the coming years to ensure operational capability and to avoid catastrophic failure.
- SCBA Replacement – The current SCBA's were purchased in 2014 and will reach the 15-year life in 2029, with the significant changes in standards since the purchase, the department intends to replace then SCBA with newer models. The department intends to apply for grants to offset the cost of this project.
- Purchase and renovation of Sub-station – The department currently rents a bay in the Stanley Civil Defense Rescue Squad; the Board of Directors has had preliminary talks with the Stanley CD Rescue Directors about the possibility of purchasing the facility to create a permanent sub-



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station. This station would facilitate the elimination of the East Gaston Fire District's 9E area which currently contains approximately \$47.7 Million in property values and could potentially save citizens approximately \$218,421 in insurance premiums annually. If allowed the department intends to pursue a Community Block Grant for the purchase and renovation of the facility.

The East Gaston Volunteer Fire Department continually evaluates the department's budget to ensure the department stays in line with the long-term strategic goals. The department and its Board of Directors maintain a working document that outlines a 5-10-15 year strategic plan to guide the department's long-term strategic decisions, albeit not all items would be considered capital purchases but are still included in the vision. The Board has expressed interest in developing a 30-year plan to cement the future of the East Gaston Volunteer Fire Department.

The Board of Directors and I are dedicated to the constant evaluation of the East Gaston Volunteer Fire Department's Budget to ensure we maintain the taxpayer's best interest.
