The Gaston County Board of Commissioners (BOC) met in Regular Session on September 27, 2022 at 3:00 p.m., in The Harley B. Gaston, Jr. Public Forum, Gaston County Courthouse.

Chairman Chad Brown presided with Commissioners Bob Hovis, Vice-Chairman; Allen R. Fraley, Kim Johnson (via telephone), Tom Keigher and Ronnie Worley in attendance.

Commissioner Tracy L. Philbeck was not in attendance.

Others present included Dr. Kim Eagle, County Manager; William T. Stetzer, County Attorney; and Angela Stacks, Deputy Clerk to the Board.

Upon request of Chairman Brown, Commissioner Hovis led those assembled in the Invocation and Commissioner Worley led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Hearing - RE: Commissioner Keigher - EDC - To Approve a Gaston County Level One Incentive Grant Pursuant to N.C.Gen.Stat. §158-7.1 and To Authorize Gaston County to Enter into an Economic Development Agreement (EDA) with Tectonic Real Estate

Chairman Brown announced the Public Hearings as advertised and explained procedures to be used. Hearing no objections to enter into Public Hearing, the Chairman moved to item I., C., as titled above, and introduced Mrs. Sara Gilbert-Kay, Economic Development Commission Project Administrator, for comments.

Mrs. Gilbert-Kay advised Tectonic has proposed to build a 188,000SF building on Jenkins Dairy Road with a total investment of approximately \$9M; it is anticipated the investment will qualify for a Level One Incentive Grant; the site has been passed over for more than 60 years and additionally, it is on an infill area; the project is anticipated to generate \$75k/year in tax revenue; EDC is requesting the BOC to approve a Level One Incentive Grant for the project; the Gastonia City Council approved it on September 20th.

Chairman Brown called for citizen comment and for questions from the BOC; none was heard.

Chairman Brown declared the Public Hearing closed and called for a motion to approve.

Commissioner Hovis introduced the motion to approve and Commissioner Worley provided the second. Chairman Brown called for Commissioner Johnson's voice vote and called for the vote from the remaining members (via show of hands) and **2022-264** carried unanimously as follows:

- WHEREAS, Tectonic Real Estate is considering a total investment of \$9,430,200 (\$50/sq.ft.) to establish a 188,604 square foot warehouse and distribution facility in the Tectonic Building on Jenkins Dairy Rd. with the expectation to complete this investment on or before December 31, 2025; and,
- WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute §158-7.1 authorizes a County to undertake an economic development project by providing grants for the location of industry; and,
- WHEREAS, Gaston County developed an economic grant policy to provide global advanced manufacturing companies and distribution facilities with high quality industrial park locations; and,

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- WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the Company's capital investment in and at the Property and its operations thereat will generate significant ad valorem tax, sales tax and other revenues to the County and will qualify for a Level One Grant; and,
- WHEREAS, the County will prepare a detailed Economic Development Agreement (EDA), between Tectonic Real Estate, the County, and the City of Gastonia, so as to induce the company to provide good job opportunities and capital investment which will enhance the County's ability to attract additional business and industry.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Gaston County Board of Commissioners approves a Level One Grant and authorizes the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or the County Manager to execute any documents necessary to complete an Economic Development Agreement for Tectonic Real Estate.

Public Hearing - RE: Commissioner Keigher - EDC - To Approve a Gaston County Level One Incentive Grant Pursuant to N.C.Gen.Stat. §158-7.1 and To Authorize Gaston County to Enter into an Economic Development Agreement (EDA) with Foundry Commercial

Chairman Brown introduced Mrs. Gilbert-Kay for comments.

Mrs. Gilbert-Kay advised Foundry Commercial propose to design and construct a 280,000SF building in the Southridge Business Park in Bessemer City; approximately a \$14M investment; originally the site was not in inventory; Mr. Josh Ross worked with Bessemer City and sent through a lengthy property exchange to expand the Southridge Business Park which will allow County to use the existing infrastructure; the Bessemer City Council approved the project on September 12th; proposed completion date of project is November 20, 2023; EDC is requesting BOC to approve a Level One Incentive Grant for the project.

Chairman Brown called for citizen comment; hearing none, called for questions from the BOC.

Chairman Brown asked where the project would be located.

Mrs. Gilbert-Kay responded Southridge Business Park.

Chairman Brown declared the Public Hearing closed and called for a motion to approve.

Commissioner Hovis introduced the motion to approve and Commissioner Keigher provided the second. Chairman Brown called for Commissioner Johnson's voice vote and called for the vote from the remaining members (via show of hands) and **2022-265** carried unanimously as follows:

- WHEREAS, Foundry Commercial is considering a total investment of \$14,023,000 (450/sq.ft.) to establish a 280,460 square foot warehouse and distribution facility in the Southridge Business Park, with the expectation to complete this investment on or before November, 2023; and,
- WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute §158-7.1 authorizes a County to undertake an economic development project by providing grants for the location of industry; and,
- WHEREAS, Gaston County developed an economic grant policy to provide global advanced manufacturing companies and distribution facilities with high quality industrial park locations; and,
- WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the company's capital investment in and at the property and its operations thereat will generate significant ad valorem tax, sales tax and other revenues to the County and will qualify for a Level One Grant; and,

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- WHEREAS, the County will prepare a detailed Economic Development Agreement (EDA), between Foundry Commercial, the County and Bessemer City, so as to induce the company to provide good job opportunities and capital investment which will enhance the County's ability to attract additional business and industry.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Gaston County Board of Commissioners approves a Level One Grant and authorizes the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or the County Manager to execute any documents necessary to complete an Economic Development Agreement for Foundry Commercial.

Public Hearing - Re: Commissioner Brown - Proposed Schedules, Standards, and Rules to be Used in the 2023 Reappraisal of Real Property

Chairman Brown introduced Ms. Chelsea Tarbush, Interim Tax Director, for comments.

Ms. Tarbush advised the Schedule of Values was presented to BOC at its August 23rd meeting; BOC will vote to adopt it on October 25th; staff will advertise the adoption four times in *The Gaston Gazette*; November 28th is the last day citizens can appeal the Schedule of Values before the NC Property Tax Commission in Raleigh; public meetings are scheduled between now and end of year; staff will begin meeting with the municipalities in December to discuss 2023 projections and to set up locations; there are new website tools and appeals on line for convenience of citizens; the values will be effective January 1st; reappraisal notices will be mailed to all citizens in mid-February; the informal appeals process begins the end of February; the formal appeals process begins in May; 2023 tax bills will be mailed out on July 21, 2023.

Chairman Brown called for citizen comment; hearing none, called for questions from the BOC.

Chairman Brown asked when the township meetings will begin.

Ms. Tarbush responded some will occur in October and November; trying to complete those by end of November so that staff can meet with the municipalities about the 2023 projections.

Chairman Brown advised that staff is putting together a video scenario of how to appeal property values.

Chairman Brown declared the Public Hearing closed and moved to the next item of business.

Chairman Brown introduced Ms. Twanna Littlejohn, Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS - Access Division) Transportation Coordinator, for comments.

Ms. Littlejohn requested permission to apply for the NCDOT/PTD FY24 Community Transportation Program grant; purpose of grant is to support public and human service

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transportation in rural areas; the grant will fund Transportation Coordinator's salary/fringe benefits, Accounting Tech II salaries, training, travel, office supplies and computer software; total amount of grant is \$224,058 and requires a local match of 15% (\$33,610).

Chairman Brown called for citizen comment and for questions from the BOC; none was heard.

Chairman Brown declared the Public Hearing closed and called for a motion to approve.

Commissioner Fraley introduced the motion to approve and Commissioner Worley provided the second. Chairman Brown called for Commissioner Johnson's voice vote and called for the vote from the remaining members (via show of hands) and **2022-266** carried unanimously as follows:

 - WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation's ("USDOT") Reconnecting Communities Pilot ("RCP") Discretionary Grant Program provides technical assistance and grant funding for planning and capital construction to address infrastructure barriers, restore community connectivity, and improve peoples' lives; and,
 - WHEREAS, the Downtown Gastonia Reconnector Project was identified as a project in the *NC-7 Corridor Study and Plan*, completed in January 2018 by the City of Gastonia and the Gaston County Economic Development Commission; and,

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- WHEREAS, Gaston County supports the City of Gastonia application seeking a RCP Grant from the USDOT to complete a feasibility study to cap the railroad ditch that runs through Downtown Gastonia, which creates a barrier to mobility, connectivity, access, and economic development to the transportation disadvantaged communities to the north; and,
- WHEREAS, over the last 30 years, the decline of the neighborhoods north of the railroad corridor are a direct indication of the lack of connectivity and accessibility; and,
- WHEREAS, this project is imperative as the City of Gastonia, along with many community partners, strive to address and reduce the inequities that the railroad ditch has caused in the neighborhoods to the north, hampering mobility and community connectivity; and,
- WHEREAS, the feasibility study will address issues including physical mobility and connectivity, as well as community needs and identity, health disparity, race and social equity, and economic development potential; and,
- WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia and community partners are working together to shape a community where everyone can thrive by advancing equity and inclusion and dismantling systemic inequities; and,
- WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia is committed to collaborating with community partners to facilitate a coordinated and innovative approach to this work; and,
- WHEREAS, the Downtown Gastonia Reconnector Project is transformational and RCP funding is critical to advance this project by the completion of a feasibility study to understand the technical and financial feasibilities of capping the railroad ditch while looking to maximize public benefits by way of better mobility and connectivity, and assessing various development opportunities.

County Manager's Report

The County Manager presented - Re: International City/County Manager's Association (ICMA) Veterans Local Government Management Fellowship, Connecting Veterans to Local Government presented:

- Presented handout from the ICMA; County has a partnership with ICMA that works with veterans within 180 days of ending active duty to assist them in transitioning into a fellowship with local governments
- The County can benefit from the experience they gained in education or active military service and aid them in transitioning back to civilian life
- In the process of taking applications at no cost to the County; there are tremendous benefits for the County and for those coming out of military service; wanted the BOC to be aware of the program.

Chairman Brown advised the BOC will open up the zoning public hearings.

Public Hearing - RE: Commissioner Fraley - Building & Development Services - Zoning Map Change: Z22-23 Delores Barrett (Applicant); Property Parcel: 219660, Located at 338 Carpenter Rd., Bessemer City, NC, Rezone from (R-1) Single Family Limited Zoning District to the (R-3) Single Family General Zoning District

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Chairman Brown recognized Mrs. Sarah Penley, Building & Development Services Senior Planner, for comments.

Mrs. Penley advised Ms. Delores Barrett (Applicant) and the Property Owners (Heirs of Annie Sue Gillespie) of subject rezoning request are asking BOC to rezone parcel 219660, located at 338 Carpenter Rd., Bessemer City, NC, from (R-1) Single Family Limited Zoning District to the (R-3) Single Family General Zoning District; currently one residential structure occupies the property; since submitting the application, the property owners subdivided it into two parcels which makes it compliant to adding an additional home.

She reviewed aerial, zoning and adjacent property owners maps and advised the property is located in the northwest region of the County, east of Cherryville, north of Bessemer City and north of Dallas-Cherryville Hwy.; the area is mostly surrounded by vacant large tracts of properties, some residential structures (mixed architectural types) and is rural in nature; zoning districts in area includes R-1, R-2 (to north and east), commercial and industrial to the south along the Dallas-Cherryville Hwy. corridor; the map of property owners list those notified of the public hearing.

The Planning Board met on September 12 and voted 5-1 to recommend approval; Planning Board had concerns about other uses included in the R-3 that are not included in the R-1 Single Family limited zoning district; staff explained the biggest difference were the housing types; there are some other uses allowed in the R-3 district that are not in the R-1; those uses would go before the Board of Adjustments to seek a Special Use Permit.

Staff finds the application, as presented, is consistent with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan (Comp Plan); notices were mailed out and signs were posted per County policy; this concludes the presentation.

Chairman Brown called for comments from the Applicant.

Ms. Delores Barrett (Applicant), 338 Carpenter Rd., Bessemer City, NC, advised her son wants to put a single-wide modular home on the lot beside her lot which would be 340 Carpenter Rd.

Chairman Brown called for citizen comments; hearing none, called for questions from the BOC.

Commissioner Keigher asked what township the lot resided in.

Mrs. Penley responded the Cherryville township; it is on the border of the Dallas Township.

Chairman Brown declared the Public Hearing closed.

Chairman Brown introduced the County Attorney to summarize the Planning Board's recommendation.

The County Attorney advised the Planning Board recommended approval 5-1 finding it to be consistent with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan.

Chairman Brown called for a motion to approve.

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Commissioner Fraley introduced the motion to approve and Commissioner Hovis provided the second. Chairman Brown called for Commissioner Johnson's voice vote and called for the vote from the remaining members (via show of hands) and the BOC unanimously approved **2022-308**, upon consideration of the map change application, public hearing comment and recommendation from the Planning Board and Planning staff, finds:

1) The map change request is consistent with the County's approved Comprehensive Land Use Plan. The proposed rezoning is in the Rural future land use plan. The area consists of mixed housing types that are residential in nature. The use, going from (R-1) to (R-3) will maintain the subject parcel as residential in nature, which is consistent with the Rural designation.

The Commission considers this action to be reasonable and in the public interest, based on: Planning Board recommendation and compatibility with existing land uses in the immediate area. Therefore, the map change request for Property parcel: 219660, is hereby approved, effective with the passage of this Resolution.

2) The County Manager is authorized to make necessary notifications in this matter to appropriate parties.

Chairman Brown asked the County Attorney to provide the Consistency Statement.

The County Attorney read the following Consistency Statement: The proposed rezoning is in the Rural future land use plan. The area consists of mixed housing types that are residential in nature. The use, going from (R-1) to (R-3) will maintain the subject parcel as residential in nature, which is consistent with the Rural designation (and the Comprehensive Land Use Plan).

Public Hearing - RE: Commissioner Fraley - Building & Development Services - Zoning Map Change: Z22-24 Christopher Scott Allen (Applicant); Property Parcel: 162968, Located at Hoyles Woods Trail, Kings Mountain, NC, Rezone from the (R-1) Single Family Limited Zoning District to the (R-2) Single Family Moderate Zoning District

Chairman Brown recognized Mrs. Penley for comments.

Mrs. Penley advised Mr. Christopher Scott Allen, the Applicant/Property Owner, is requesting to rezone parcel 162968 located at Hoyles Woods Trail, Kings Mountain, NC, from the (R-1) Single Family Limited Zoning District to the (R-2) Single Family Moderate Zoning District in its entirety (1.04 acres); currently the property is vacant and undeveloped.

She reviewed aerial, zoning and property owners maps and advised the property is located in the northwest region of the County, east of the Cleveland/Gaston County line, southeast of Cherryville and northwest of Bessemer City; surrounding parcels are residential in nature or large tracts of vacant or undeveloped property; zoning districts in area includes R-1, R-2, light commercial and light industrial; adjoining property owners map list those notified of the public hearing.

The Planning Board met on September 12 and voted unanimously to recommend approval of the application.

Staff finds the application, as presented, is consistent with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan; notices were mailed out per County policy; staff received one call for general information from an adjoining property owner; this concludes the presentation.

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Chairman Brown called for comments from the Applicant and for citizen comment; hearing none, called for questions from the BOC.

Commissioner Hovis advised it appears like the adjacent property owner is sectioning out a portion of lot #1 to rezone instead of the entire property.

Mrs. Penley responded that parcel is not part of this property; Mr. Scott owns parcels 5, 6 and 7 (three abutting properties); this involves an individual parcel of its own; those parcels were zoned R-2; Applicant thought that parcel was zoned R-2 also.

Commissioner Hovis inquired about the access point location.

Mrs. Penley responded the property is accessed via a private easement that is family owned and maintained.

Chairman Brown declared the Public Hearing closed.

Chairman Brown introduced the County Attorney to summarize the Planning Board's recommendation.

The County Attorney advised the Planning Board unanimously recommended approval of the rezoning request.

Chairman Brown called for a motion to approve.

Commissioner Fraley introduced the motion to approve and Commissioner Hovis provided the second. Chairman Brown called for Commissioner Johnson's voice vote and called for the vote from the remaining members (via show of hands) and the BOC unanimously approved **2022-309**, upon consideration of the map change application, public hearing comment and recommendation from the Planning Board and Planning staff, finds:

1) The map change request is consistent with the County's approved Comprehensive Land Use Plan. The proposed rezoning is in the Rural future land use plan. The area consists of mixed housing types that are residential in nature. The use, going from (R-1) to (R-2) will maintain the subject parcel as residential in nature, which is consistent with the Rural designation.

The Commission considers this action to be reasonable and in the public interest, based on: Planning Board recommendation and compatibility with existing land uses in the immediate area. Therefore, the map change request for Property parcel: 162968, is hereby approved, effective with the passage of this Resolution.

The use, going from (R-1) to (R-2) will maintain the subject parcel as residential in nature, which is consistent with the Rural designation (of the Comprehensive Land Use Plan).

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Other Matters

Commissioner Keigher – Re: The Waggoner Memorial Gardens: Advised he and the County Manager attended the Gaston Low-Cost Spay/Neuter Clinic's grand opening of The Waggoner Memorial Gardens (across from County Police Department) last Friday; it is a beautiful and quiet place; urged the BOC to go view it.

Chairman Brown – Re: School Resource Officers (SROs): Officers Rodney Hamilton and Jonathon Marr, School Resource Officers (SROs) were asked to come forward to be recognized for the hard and diligent work they do in the school system; advised that some comments in the newspaper were taken out of context and noted it is the school system's job to alert and provide information to parents and is not the SROs job. Their job is to provide safety in the schools; he thanked Officers Hamilton and Marr and their fellow SRO officers for the job they do.

Commissioner Hovis agreed and stated the BOC has funded SROs for the schools and has a commitment to that program. He added that the job of an SRO is much more than being a deterrent; SROs develop relationships with our students and their families that involves trust and a level of confidentiality.

Chairman Brown referenced the Forum on School Violence that was held on Monday night and noted the County Police Chief was in attendance; there was also someone outside doing mental evaluations; the County has the right people in the right spots; the County Police and Sheriff's Office do a great job of protecting the County.

Adjournment

Chairman Brown called for a motion to adjourn.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Hovis and seconded by Commissioner Worley, the BOC unanimously adjourned the Regular Meeting of September 27, 2022 at 3:45 pm.
