## JUSTIFICATION FOR REQUEST:

Accept and Appropriate \$259,073 in State funding awarded by the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (NCDA&CS) for the StreamFlow Rehabilitation Assistance Program (StRAP). Grant funding is provided for stream debris removal and streambank stabilization on Duhart Creek. Any funds not expended by the end of FY25 would be carried forward to FY26 and FY27, as applicable to be spent by the end of the grant period (December 31, 2026).
