

### RESOLUTION TITLE: A RESOLUTION BY THE COUNTY OF GASTON TO DIRECT THE EXPENDITURE OF OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDS

- WHEREAS, Gaston County has joined national settlement agreements with companies engaged in the manufacturing, distribution, and dispensing of opioids, including settlements with drug distributors Cardinal, McKesson, and AmerisourceBergen, and the drug maker Johnson & Johnson and its subsidiary Janssen Pharmaceuticals; and,
- WHEREAS, the allocation, use, and reporting of funds stemming from these national settlement agreements and certain bankruptcy resolutions ("Opioid Settlement Funds") are governed by the Memorandum of Agreement Between the State of North Carolina and Local Governments on Proceeds Relating to the Settlement of Opioid Litigation ("MOA"); and,
- WHEREAS, Gaston County has received Opioid Settlement Funds pursuant to these national settlement agreements and deposited the Opioid Settlement Funds in a separate special revenue fund as required by section D of the MOA; and,
- WHEREAS, section E.6 of the MOA states:
  - E.6. Process for drawing from special revenue funds.
    - a. <u>Budget item or resolution required</u>. Opioid Settlement Funds can be used for a purpose when the Governing Body includes in its budget or passes a separate resolution authorizing the expenditure of a stated amount of Opioid Settlement Funds for that purpose or those purposes during a specified period of time.
    - b. <u>Budget item or resolution details</u>. The budget or resolution should (i) indicate that it is an authorization for expenditure of opioid settlement funds; (ii) state the specific strategy or strategies the county or municipality intends to fund pursuant to Option A or Option B, using the item letter and/or number in Exhibit A or Exhibit B to identify each funded strategy, and (iii) state the amount dedicated to each strategy for a stated period of time.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, in alignment with the NC MOA, <u>Gaston County</u> authorizes the expenditure of opioid settlement funds as follows:
  - 1. First strategy authorized
    - a. Name of strategy: Recovery Support Services
    - b. Strategy is included in Exhibit A
    - c. Item letter and/or number in Exhibit A or Exhibit B to the MOA: Exhibit A, Strategy 3

- d. Amounted authorized for this strategy: \$52,328.64
- e. Period of time during which expenditure may take place: Start date January 1, 2024 through End date December 31, 2025
- f. Description of the program, project, or activity: <u>Gaston Emergency Medical Services'</u> <u>Community Paramedicine Program: Expanded hours for the certified peer support</u> <u>specialist services currently embedded in Gaston Emergency Medical Services</u> (GEMS).

Currently, GEMS deploys peer support specialists twenty-four hours a week. They respond to opioid-related calls with the community paramedic and offer support to individuals in real-time. They also provide ongoing support to individuals who are enrolled in the medication-assisted treatment bridge program and follow up with individuals who refuse treatment and care following an overdose. Additional funds will allow peer support specialists to be deployed thirty-six hours a week. Expanding the hours will increase effectiveness of existing initiatives and contribute to the overall wellbeing of individuals affected by opioid use disorders.

g. Provider: Gaston Emergency Medical Services

The total dollar amount of Opioid Settlement Funds appropriated across the above named and authorized strategies is <u>\$ 52,328.64</u>.

#### **BUDGET ORDINANCE IMPACT**

### BACKGROUND

The State of NC joined in the national litigation against pharmaceutical supply chain participants who engaged in the manufacture, marketing, promotion, distribution, or dispensing of opioid medications that has harmed the public. On June 8, 2021, the Board of Commissioners approved the Memorandum of Agreement Between the State of North Carolina and Local Governments on Proceeds Relating to the Settlement of Opioid Litigation (Res 2021-172) joining in the national litigation. Gaston County will receive a projected \$43,000,000 in settlement funds to be received over a period of 18 years. To date, the County has received \$4,250,134 in settlement funds. To date, \$2,758,204.70 has been allocated by the Board of Commissioners.

This Board Action and BCR appropriates \$52,328.64 of our allotment for Recovery Support Services, specifically expanded hours for the certified peer support specialist services in Gaston Emergency Medical Services (GEMS), who has a contract with Olive Branch Ministry. Currently, GEMS deploys peer support specialists twenty-four hours a week. They respond to opioid-related calls with the on-duty community paramedic and can offer support to individuals in real-time. Additionally, they provide ongoing support to individuals who are enrolled in the medication-assisted treatment bridge program and follow up with individuals who refuse treatment and care following an overdose. Additional funds will allow peer support specialists to be deployed thirty-six hours a week. Increasing the hours will expand a program that's proven effective and allow Gaston County to leverage other funds to provide the program. Expanded hours will increase effectiveness of existing initiatives and contribute to the overall well-being of individuals affected by opioid use disorders.

This Board Action, if approved, appropriates \$52,328.64 in Opioid Settlement funds to GEMS for the purpose of expanding their current contract with Olive Branch Ministry to embed certified peer support specialists in their Community Paramedicine program.
