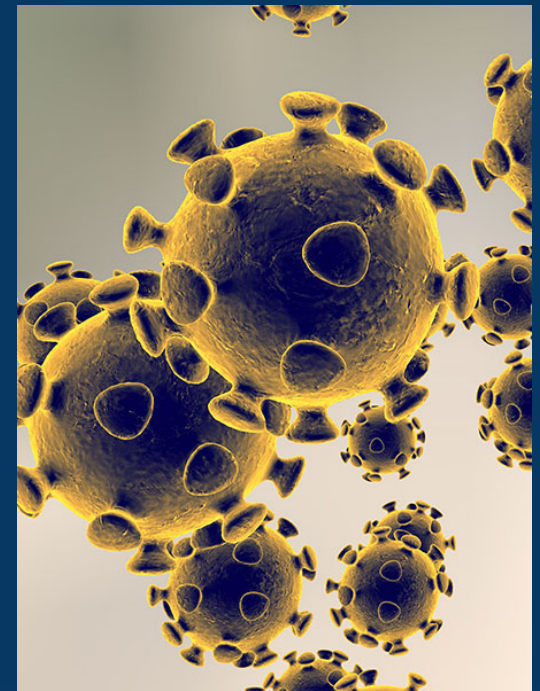

Coronavirus vs. Flu

Coronavirus

- 800+ confirmed cases in US
- 28 deaths in US
- 7 confirmed cases in NC

Influenza

- 34 million+ illnesses in US
- 20,000+ deaths in US
- 127 deaths in NC

Our Role

- Monitoring returned travelers from high-risk areas
- Ensuring communication with local EMS, hospitals and healthcare providers
- Ensuring wraparound services for persons under monitoring and investigation



State & National Response

- Daily updates and weekly conference calls with local health departments
- Guidance for public health, healthcare, and other sectors
- \$8.3B passed for emergency funding



NC Response

- State of Emergency declared
- Activated state emergency operation center
- Additional state resources
- Updated guidance on large gatherings, visitation policies, work arrangements and travel



Testing

- Providers can collect samples if patient meets criteria
- State providing additional collection kits this week
- We expect more positive tests in the coming days and are preparing to respond and monitor

High-Risk Populations

- Over 65 years of age
- Underlying health conditions including heart disease, lung disease, or diabetes with weakened immune systems
- Should avoid travel and crowds as much as possible



What the public needs to know:

- Remain calm – risk is low
- Practice good health & hygiene
- Consider practicing “social distancing”
- Monitor LOCAL conditions
- “Call before you come”
