- 10,846 children in foster care
- 6,057 total licensed foster homes

- Delayed permanency
- Academic difficulties
- Developing meaningful attachments
- Psychological development

Top Reasons for Children Entering Foster Care in North Carolina and Gaston County



- Neglect
- Drug Abuse by Parents
- Housing Instability
- Physical Abuse



Gaston County Foster Care Statistics





Key Data

- Children in Foster Care: 351
- Licensed Foster Homes: 92
- Capacity of Local Homes: 182
 (only 51% of children in care)
- Racial demographic breakdown for children in foster care:
 - Caucasian: **66.5**%
 - African American: 23.6%
 - Other ethnicities: 9.9%

Key Issues

- Nearly half of foster children (175) are placed outside of their community
- Children with severe behavioral and medical needs

Key Data

- Average months in custody for children currently in Foster Care
 - 26.6
 - Their average age is just over 8 years old
- Average months for a child with a current plan of adoption
 - 35.7
 - Their average age is 6.5 years old

- Availability of therapeutic providers
- Length of Legal Process

Recent Trends in Gaston County



Foster Care Since June 2023

- 133 children entered foster care since June 2023
- 48 children have been reunified with their families
- 58 children have been adopted
- 19 obtained permanency through Guardianship

Community Call to Action



- Gaston County has over 700 churches
- If one family from each church became a licensed foster home, the local crisis could be significantly alleviated
