- COUNTIES PROVIDE DUMPSTERS & TRASH BAGS




WATER QUALITY - SWIM GUIDES

- SPONSORED 2 SWIM GUIDES ON LAKE WYLIE
- CATAWBA RIVERKEEPER PROGRAM
 SAMPLED FOR E-COLI ON THURSDAYS
 RESULTS ON WEBSITE APP ON FRIDAYS
 TO ADVISE WEEKEND SWIMMERS
- OVER 160,000 HITS IN THE 2024 SEASON
 - LAKE WYLIE 14,000 HITS



WATER QUALITY - DATA



Lake Wylie

- Routine lake monitoring for July conducted on 7/24/24
- Average water temperature on day of sampling = 85.5 F
- Lake level on day of monitoring = 97.8 ft (target = 97.0 ft)
- Average water clarity on day of monitoring = 1.26 m (4.1 ft)



INTER-BASIN TRANSFER (IBT)

- LWMC SUGGESTS SPECIFIC CHARLOTTE WATER
 PLANS TO REDUCE WATER CONSUMPTION
 - LIMIT SEDIMENTATION
 - CONTROL/STORE RAINWATER RUNOFF
 - WITH DUKE, DREDGE TARGETED
 SHALOW AREAS TO INCREASE CAPACITY
 - IMPLEMENT CORRECTIVE ACTIONS TO PREVENT RECURRENCE OF IBTs

SEDIMENTATION – EROSION CONTROL

- MECKLENBURG COUNTY STRONGEST EROSION AND STORMWATER CONTROL MEASURES (E&SCMs)
- YORK COUNTY UPGRADED ORDINANCES IN 2019
- GASTON COUNTY
 - SITE PLAN APPROVED BEFORE GRADING
 - NO PERMITS BEFORE REZONING
 - PHASE CLEARING OF SITES
 - BUT FEW SPECIFIC E&SCMs IN ORDINANCES
- WITH CATAWBA RIVERKEEPER, PURSUING ENHANCED E&SCMS IN MUNICIPALITY ORDINANCES

CHARTER BOAT AND RENTAL VESSEL REGULATION WITHDRAWN

- CONFLICT WITH NORTH CAROLINA CONSTITUTION
- THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL NOT ENACT ANY PRIVATE, SPECIAL ACT, OR LOCAL RESOLUTION REGULATING TRADE
- ANY PRIVATE, SPECIAL ACT, OR LOCAL RESOLUTION ENACTED IN VILOATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE VOID.

INSURANCE REGULATION

 PERSONAL WATERCRAFT INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS ARE INCONSISTENT BETWEEN NORTH CAROLINA AND SOUTH CAROLINA

 NC – OWNER MUST HAVE <u>COMMERCIAL</u> LIABILTY INSURANCE <u>AND PROVIDE SAME TO RENTEE</u>

 SC – BOTH OWNER AND RENTEE ARE LIABLE; NO INSURANCE REQUIREMENT

 NORTH CAROLINA WILDLIFE FEDERATION
 - LONG TERM PROJECT WILL MEET WEEKLY
- DUMPSTERS, BARGES, AND CRANES
- VOLUNTEER AND CONTRACTED WORK
- DEADHEADS, IMPLANTED TREES IN LAKE WYLIE
- SEDIMENTATION PHOSPHORUS



ENVIRONMENT - LYNGBYA (Microseria wollei)

- INVASIVE SPECIES IF CYANOBACTERIA
- LYNGBYA APPEARS AS ALGAL "MATS" RISING FROM THE LAKE BED
- NEW TO THE CATAWBA RIVER BASIN

ENVIRONMENT - LYNGBYA

- NORTH CAROLINA STATE UNIVERSITY AQUATIC PLANT MANAGEMENT PROGRAM
 - RESEARCHING LAKE GASTON LYNGBYA PROBLEM
 - CHEMICAL TREATMENT IS EFFECTIVE

 APRIL TO SEPTEMBER TREATMENTS; 3 TO 4 YEARS
- COST TO TREAT LAKE GASTON
 - \$718K IN 2021
 - 2024 ESTIMATED TO BE \$1.3M
- LAKE NORMAN \$60K
- LAKE WYLIE \$31K



ENVIRONMENT - LYNGBYA

- LYNGBYA ADDED TO THE LIST FOR NC FUNDING,
 BUT FUNDING IS FOR LAKES THROUGHOUT NC
- STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING NOW
- DUKE, LWMC, LNMC, CHARLOTTE WATER,
 NORTH CAROLINA STATE UNIVERSITY
 - CONVENE LYNGBYA CONFERENCE IN JANUARY
 - PRESENT DATA ON EFFICACY OF TREATMENTS
 - HURRICANE HELENE'S EFFECT ON LYNGBYA
 - SPECIFIC FUNDING NEEDED TO COMBAT LYGNBYA
