#### BACKGROUND

Travel & Tourism and Parks & Rec work together to split the cost of installing lights at the Pump Track at Poston Park. The bid was obtained through Parks & Rec by Musco Sports Lighting, LLC for a total of \$126,525 which will be split between T&T and Parks and Rec. Each portion is \$63,253. Funds will come from T&T's Fund Balance.

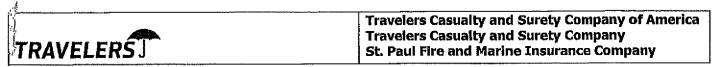
