

RESOLUTION TITLE: SURPLUS AND DISPOSITION OF GERMAN SHEPHERD K-9

- WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute 160A-266 (C) dictates the procedure for disposal of surplus property; and,
- WHEREAS, The Gaston County Police Department has a nine (9) year old male German Shepherd K-9 by the name of Mack that is failing to perform his duties as a member of the K-9 team in handler protection, building searches, criminal apprehension, narcotics detection, and tracking due to age; and,
- WHEREAS, K-9 Mack has been examined and treated by a veterinarian licensed by the State of North Carolina. K-9 Mack is unable to perform the duties required such as tracking, handler protection/apprehension, building searches, etc. due to the age and loss of stamina. Captain J.R. Phelps, K-9 Unit Commander, advises that he feels the safety of the K-9 and its handler is becoming an issue. Captain Phelps recommends K-9 Mack be retired at this point.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Gaston County Board of Commissioners that:

- 1. This nine (9) year old German Shepherd K-9 be declared as surplus and removed from Gaston County's inventory.
- 2. The Gaston County Manager be authorized to dispose of this K-9 according to North Carolina General Statute 160A-266 (C), and make this K-9 available for private sale to K-9 handler E.K. Anthony, who will be responsible for all further medical and housing expenses once Mack is retired.
