- WHEREAS, Project WONDER WOMAN is considering an investment of \$30,000,000 to construct a an advanced manufacturing operation to Gaston County, including the installation of machinery and equipment and the establishment of a North American corporate office and the creation of at least two hundred new jobs (200) expecting to pay an average annual wage of \$46,100 which is above the 2017 average annual wage of Gaston County of \$38,438; and,
- WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute §158-7.1 authorizes a County to undertake an economic development project by providing grants and land conveyance for the location of industry in order to increase the local tax base and provide quality jobs; and,
- WHEREAS, the Gaston County Board of Commissioners finds that it is in the best interests of the County to offer a standard level three grant for Project WONDER WOMAN; and,

BACKGROUND

The Gaston County Board of Commissioners (BOC) has supported economic development for over 20 years in an effort to diversify and expand the tax base in the County. The BOC recognizes the impact of the recession and in order to promote new investment, the BOC proposes to amend the County Investment Grant Program again in 2018 to include a 50% grant based on net new taxes paid on investments within the parameters of the grant program.

RESOLUTION TITLE: TO UPDATE THE PROVISIONS OF THE GASTON COUNTY INVESTMENT GRANT PROGRAM TO EXTEND THE SMALL BUSINESS INVESTMENT GRANT PROGRAM THROUGH CALENDAR YEAR 2018

- **WHEREAS,** the Gaston County Board of Commissioners has supported economic development for more than twenty years, with an emphasis on tax base development, employer diversification, and job creation; and,
- WHEREAS, The Commission recognizes the need to provide programs and financial support to strengthen and diversify the County's economy, because tax base development is the key to the County's fiscal health; and,
- **WHEREAS,** it is important not only to attract new investment but also to encourage existing businesses to expand and reinvest in their Gaston County operations; and,
- **WHEREAS,** the Gaston County Small Business Investment Grant Program is intended to combat the effects of the recession and high rate of unemployment, and to provide an inducement for new business to locate in Gaston County and encourage existing business to expand in Gaston County; and,
- **WHEREAS,** the proposed small business program provides a temporary grant to companies investing in Gaston County that is based upon the investment made by the company in calendar year 2018 upon the following conditions:
 - Investment Grants will be based on the net increase in tax value of all real property, machinery and improvements above the base year prior to investment. No grant will be given to a company that would reduce their tax payment to an amount lower than the previous tax year.
 - Asset purchases, mergers and acquisitions of existing companies already paying taxes in Gaston County would not qualify for the program.
 - Grant funds will represent a percentage of the company's tax payment. The company must be current with all other payments required by Gaston County.

- No company may transfer grant agreement or contracts without explicit approval by the Gaston County Board of Commissioners.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Gaston County Board of Commissioners that the Gaston County Investment Grant Program as adopted by Resolution No. 2006-065, dated February 9, 2006, is hereby amended to approve the one-year extension of the Gaston County Small Business Investment Grant for the 2018 calendar year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Small Business Investment Grant program shall sunset on December 31, 2018, and shall apply to investments made during the 2018 calendar year.

Local Investment Grant Program

Availability

The following investment grant program is available in Gaston County, Gastonia, Bessemer City, Belmont, Cherryville, Dallas, Mount Holly, Stanley and Cramerton.

Purpose

The Gaston County Board of Commissioners has supported economic development for more than twenty years with an emphasis on tax base development, employer diversification and job creation. The Commission has recognized the need to provide programs and financial support to strengthen and diversify the County's economy. Tax base development is a key concern for the County's fiscal health. It is essential not only to attract new investment but also to encourage existing business to expand and reinvest in their Gaston County operations. The Gaston County Investment Grant Program (GCIGP) is intended to provide an inducement for new business to locate in Gaston County and encourage existing business to expand.

Grant Program Description

The program provides grants to companies investing in Gaston County. The grant will be established by an application with Gaston County. The company must pay their taxes in full each year based on the actual tax value of the property or investment. If the company meets all of the criteria in the application, a portion of the property tax will be returned as a grant. The amount of the grant is based on a sliding scale.

Investment Grants will be based on the increase in tax value of all real property, machinery and improvements above the base year prior to investment. No grant will be given to a company that would reduce their tax payment to an amount lower than the previous tax year. Purchases of any existing Gaston County facility or equipment will not qualify for the program.

All grant monies will be taken directly from the company's tax payment. The company must be current with all other payments required by Gaston County.

The Gaston County Board of Commissioners may modify or eliminate the program subject to meeting all existing grant obligations in effect at the time. No company may transfer grant agreements of contracts without explicit approval by the Gaston County Board of Commissioners.

The Gaston County Investment Grant Program is intended to diversify the tax base, improve employment opportunities for Gaston County citizens, and create an increase in the net depreciable taxable value of the tax base of Gaston County. The Gaston County Tax Department and the Gaston County Economic Development Commission shall establish procedures for the implementation of the Program. Grant applications shall be reviewed and verified by the Tax Department and the EDC. Any interpretation of the application and/or approved Grant of the program to a specific project shall be subject to a yearly review by the EDC and Tax Department for eligibility in accord with this policy statement and shall be final.

Small Business Grant: (Temporary – Limited to Investments in Calendar Year 2018)

Business investments made during calendar year 2018 in an amount equal to or greater than \$10,000 and less than \$10,000,000 would qualify for the following grant.

Chief Justin Barnes presented a Certificate of Need and a 5 year plan for Tryonota Fire Department. (attached) They are planning to purchase a new Class A Pumper with 1500 to 2000 GPM Pump/1,000 Gallon Booster Tank. This apparatus will replace a 1996 Freightliner Commercial Built Engine truck that has been in service at Tryonota for 22 years. Purchasing this Pumper will reduce costs for the department in maintenance of the old truck, provide more safety features and avoid higher costs if waiting to order a new truck. 

We have done our 'due diligence' with researching everything you may want to know about this service area and property/station. In 2014, CMVFR received a rating of 7/9E. The total number of properties within the 9E rating in 2014 was 848 properties with a tax value of \$67,980,154. CMVFR looked at its options and decided that the best option for the community was to build a third station. (I would be willing to review our options with the FAB). The FAB approved for the purchase of land which CMVFR currently owns, and by approving this certificate of need for the station our project will be almost completed. Our station will be built in a high populated area where the majority of our residents are on a fixed income. BACKGROUND

Due to the estimated cost burden of upgrading the County's antiquated emergency services radio system to the next generation platform, departments providing fire and emergency services throughout Gaston County wish to collaboratively seek a Joint Regional Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) to more cost-effectively purchase and install the NC State Highway Patrol Voice Interoperability Plan for Emergency Responders (VIPER) county-wide radio system. BACKGROUND

The Gaston County Jail is located at 425 Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Way, Gastonia, NC. The current 175,758 square foot facility is no longer able to provide adequate space for the growing inmate population. Interior upfits/improvements are proposed to utilize what was previously designed as first floor recreation areas along with enhancements to existing systems to accommodate the new housing. These areas would be equipped with pre-manufactured units (cells) capable of housing an additional 60 inmates in two-bunk cells and 12 inmates in individual cells. The project includes updating existing equipment such as door controls, security systems, etc. to address operational needs for the expanded housing and inmate population. This phase of the project selects the architect of record for the work.

North Carolina General Statute (NCGS) 143-64.31 requires the initial solicitation and evaluation of firms to perform architectural, engineering, surveying, construction management-at-risk services, and design-build services (collectively "design services") to be based on qualifications and without regard to fee. NCGS 143-64.32 authorizes units of local government to exempt contracts for design services from the qualifications-based selection requirements of G.S. 143-64.31 if the estimated fee is less than \$50,000. However, design fees for this project will exceed the \$50,000 cap for exemption thereby requiring the architect/engineer to be selected through the qualifications based process. Public Works staff developed a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) packet on November 18, 2017 in accordance with the statutory requirements and publicly advertised the project beginning November 18, 2017. Statements of Qualification (SOQ) submittals were received on November 28, 2017.

After reviewing the SOQ's submitted, approval of this Board Action by the Gaston County Commission officially selects Stewart-Cooper-Newell Architects as the designer of record for the Jail infill project. Further, approval of this Board Action authorizes the County Attorney to draft the necessary contract documents for the work and authorizes the County Manager or his designee to negotiate and execute said contacts at a cost not to exceed \$600,000.
