BACKGROUND

Because of the State and Local Declarations of Emergency due to Covid-19, many small businesses have been forced to shut down operations and have no source of revenues for their business expenses. The Federal stimulus bill has been slow to trickle down to local businesses. The proposed loan program is intended to be a bridge to assist small, locally owned businesses that qualify, pending the availability of Federal Small Business Loan Program funds.

RESOLUTION TITLE: TO APPROVE A SMALL BUSINESS EMERGENCY BRIDGE LOAN PROGRAM IN GASTON COUNTY

- WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute §158-7.1 authorizes a County to undertake economic development projects by the appropriation and expenditure of funds to support private creation of jobs and tax base in the local jurisdiction; and,
- WHEREAS, the public health emergency created by the novel coronavirus COVID-19 and the subsequent declarations of states of emergency by the Federal, State and local governments has caused serious harm to locally owned small businesses in Gaston County; and,
- WHEREAS, due to the amount of time which has elapsed between Federal stimulus appropriations and the local availability of funds for small businesses, Gaston proposes to create a bridge loan fund for locally owned small businesses to help the businesses stay in operation while awaiting Federal stimulus funds; and,
- WHEREAS, the Gaston County Board of Commissioners has held a public hearing to consider whether to approve the Small Business Bridge Loan Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Gaston County Board of Commissioners:

- 1. Has determined that this appropriation will increase the population, taxable property, employment and business prospects of the County.
- 2. The County Manager is authorized and directed to implement the necessary documentation for applications and approval of loans to small locally owned businesses. Loans shall not exceed \$5,000 per business application. Terms of the loans shall be determined by the loan committee which shall be designated by the Manager.

New Hope Fire Department has served Southeastern Gaston County since 1953. The current primary response district is 14.87 square miles. The district is a diverse mixture of rural and urban settings including several waterfront neighborhoods with structures exceeding 6,000 sq. ft. In 2020 the department, along with Union Road Fire Department, will enter into a contract for service with the City of Gastonia for primary response coverage to Nolen Farms located off of Union Road.

In 2019, the department took delivery of a Pierce Enforcer Rescue-Engine. The new unit was placed in service in August and was the first purchase of a custom apparatus since 2001. Engine 50 was placed into service in 1993, followed by Tanker 50 in 1994. Brush 50 was replaced in 2018.

In 2005, the department added two part-time paid staff from 0830 until 1630 during weekdays. In 2015, the staffed hours were increased to include 0830-1630 coverage seven days per week as well as Friday and Saturday evenings until midnight. In 2019 coverage was once again expanded to 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

The department is currently responsible for a debt of \$656,072.55 to Civic Federal Credit Union. For the 2020-2021 budget year, New Hope Fire Department is requesting a tax rate increase to .10 with a total operating budget of \$544,800. The New Hope Fire Department Board of Directors approved this tax rate increase and budget on Tuesday March 10, 2020. The proposed increase will be to give pay raises to part-time staff from \$10 per hour to \$12 per hour. The increase will also place \$35,000 into savings in preparation of purchasing a new engine within the next five years. Another line increase will be used for much needed station repairs and upgrades.

The Waco Volunteer Fire Department is requesting the \$9931.53 currently in the reserve fund to help pay for the cost of radio replacement. In 2006 the Waco Fire Department was part of a regional grant to purchase 800 MGH radio equipment from FEMA. Our current radios are XTS 2500 and are considered legacy radios. These radios can no longer be repaired and need to be replaced. With Gaston County moving to 800 MGH radios and with the changes coming to the viper system in the next 5-6 years we need to have TDMA compatible radios to remain interoperable with the viper system.

The Waco Fire Department has a total operating budget of \$444,199.00 per year with the Gaston County portion being \$33,255.00 per year. Gaston county accounts for 7.4% of the total budget for the fire department. The current radio purchase agreement with Motorola is \$134,814.17. The equivalent for Gaston County at the same 7.4% is \$9976.00. Cleveland County will fund the remaining \$124,882.64. The fire department would like to use the reserve fund we currently have to fund this portion of the project. If you have any questions please feel free to give me a call.

BACKGROUND

The Child Advocacy Center (The Lighthouse) is located on the lower level of the Highland Health Center at 609 North Highland Street, Gastonia, North Carolina. The current 1,000 square foot space is not adequate to provide the services that are needed. In 2018, The Lighthouse conducted 390 forensic interviews of children who are victims of sexual abuse, physical abuse, domestic or family violence, neglect, or human trafficking. To meet the growing needs of The Lighthouse, the Bethlehem Baptist Church of Gastonia has agreed to lease a parcel of land to Gaston County to accommodate the construction of a new facility. This land is located at 3100 Bethlehem Church Road, Gastonia, North Carolina 28056. The new facility will allow space for law enforcement, social services workers, prosecutors, counselors, and Child Advocacy Center staff to help children and families heal.

North Carolina General Statute (NCGS) 143-64.31 requires the initial solicitation and evaluation of firms to perform architectural, engineering, surveying, construction management-at-risk services, and design-build services (collectively "design services") to be based on qualifications and without regard to fee. NCGS 143-64.32 authorizes units of local government to exempt contracts for design services from the qualifications-based selection requirements of G.S. 143-64.31 if the estimated fee is less than \$50,000. However, the design fee for this project will exceed the \$50,000 cap for (Continued on Page 2)

exemption thereby requiring the architect/engineer to be selected through the qualifications based process. Building Inspections staff developed a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) packet on December 20, 2018 in accordance with the statutory requirements and publicly advertised the project beginning December 20, 2018. Statements of Qualification (SOQ) submittal were received on January 24, 2019. One firm submitted an SOQ. The RFQ was reissued publicly with the intent of gaining greater interest in the project and additional SOQ's. Two SOQ's were received on March 1, 2019.

After reviewing the SOQ's submitted, as well as in-person presentations by the two firms to the Child Advocacy Center Steering Committee, the architecture firm of Stewart Cooper Newell of Gastonia, North Carolina was deemed to be the best qualified for this project. Approval of this Board Action by the Gaston County Commission officially selects Stewart Cooper Newell Architects as the designer of record for the Child Advocacy Center (The Lighthouse) project. Further, approval of this Board Action authorizes the County Attorney to draft the necessary contract documents for the work and authorizes the County Manager or her designee to negotiate and execute said contracts at a cost not to exceed\$151,975.

The Gaston County Board of Commissioners approved funding in the FY20 budget to complete ADA improvements at various County facilities. Due to age and continued usage of these facilities, the buildings and surrounding parking lots/landscaping are in disrepair and do not meet current accessibility requirements. Tindale Oliver previously conducted an in-depth study of various County facilities and provided ADA remediation recommendations to Gaston County. Based on the results of that study, C Design Inc. designed the needed repairs and prepared bidding documents for public bidding purposes. 

Funds for the FY 2020 BUILD Transportation program are to be awarded on a competitive basis for projects that will have a significant local or regional impact. The USDOT has been authorized to solicit applications for and award grants of up to \$25 million. The application process requires local jurisdictions to pass resolutions in support of the application. For the 2020 BUILD grant, the City of Gastonia, in partnership with the City of Lowell and Gaston County, will be seeking funding to construct the following:

- Aberdeen Boulevard Extension (3-lane)
 - 2,410 ft. from Cox Road to the current terminus (widening)
 - 2,911 ft. from the current terminus to the NC 7 Connector (new construction)



INTERLOCAL GRANT AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF GASTONIA FOR FUNDING THE LOCAL MATCH FOR THE CATAWBA CROSSINGS FEASIBILITY STUDY

This Agreement, made effective this the _____ day of _____, 2020, by and between the CITY OF GASTONIA, a North Carolina Municipal Corporation having a mailing address of PO Box 1748, Gastonia, NC 28053; CITY OF BELMONT, a North Carolina Municipal Corporation having a mailing address of PO Box 431, Belmont, NC 28012; TOWN OF CRAMERTON, a North Carolina Municipal Corporation having a mailing address of 155 N Main Street, Cramerton, NC 28032; and GASTON COUNTY, a body politic and a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina having a mailing address of PO Box 1578, Gastonia, NC 28053.

WITNESSETH:

THAT, WHEREAS, Article 20 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes of North Carolina authorizes any unit of local government and any one or more units of local government to enter into contracts or agreements with each other in order to execute any undertaking; and,

WHEREAS, Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act allows for the allocation of State Planning and Research (SPR) funds to be available for certain specified transportation activities; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia has requested federal funding for the Catawba Crossings Feasibility Study, hereinafter referred to as the Project, in Gaston County, North Carolina; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia has been designated as a recipient to receive funds allocated to the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) up to and not to exceed the maximum award amount of \$360,000 for the Project; and,

WHEREAS, NCDOT has allocated additional state funding, under State Bill 136-214, to provide a portion of the non-federal match, in the amount of \$67,500; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia has agreed to participate in certain costs and to assume certain responsibilities for project administration; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia shall provide the non-federal match for the reimbursable amount, up to \$22,500 and an additional \$675 for SAP charges (cost incurred by NCDOT); and,

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia has contracted with Gannett Fleming, Inc. to perform the necessary services to complete the Catawba Crossings Feasibility Study; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms, conditions and covenants hereinafter set forth, it is agreed between the parties hereto as follows:

- 1. PURPOSE: The purpose of this agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions under which The City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County will provide monies to the City of Gastonia for local match costs associated with the Catawba Crossings Feasibility Study.
- 2. PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The City of Gastonia shall engage the services of Gannett Fleming, Inc. to develop a feasibility study to evaluate a potential crossing of the Catawba River, providing a third parallel highway crossing connecting Gaston and Mecklenburg Counties.
- 3. COSTS: The total Project cost is \$512,489 and includes federal funding, state and local matches. See funding table below:

Utilizing a per capita population breakdown of the total Non-Federal Local Match, the City of Belmont shall pay a 6.1% portion of the local match in the amount of \$4,400, the Town of Cramerton shall pay a 2.52% portion of the local match in the amount of \$1,819, and Gaston County shall pay a 47.98% portion of the local match in the amount of \$34,621. Local match portions shall be paid directly to the City of Gastonia. The City of Gastonia will be responsible for another 43.41% portion of the local match in the amount of \$31,324.

4. REIMBURSEMENT: The City of Gastonia will bill the City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County accompanied by appropriate documentation justifying the request for payment. The City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County will reimburse the City of Gastonia for costs within forty-five (45) days of receipt of the request.

- 5. AGENCY: The City of Gastonia shall ensure the Project is completed within a reasonable time after the execution of this Agreement. This Agreement is not to establish any kind of joint agency or partnership agreement between the parties.
- 6. ACCESS: The City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County retain the right to inspect documents, materials, papers and other related items at any point in the Project, with proper notification to the City of Gastonia.
- 7. INSURANCE AND INDEMNITY: The City of Gastonia shall at all times indemnify, save, protect, and keep harmless the City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County from all costs, loss, damage, liability, expense, penalty and fines which may arise from or be claimed against them by any person or persons, firms or corporations, for any injuries to persons or property, or damage for whatever kind or character consequent upon or arising from this Agreement by reason of any negligent act of the City of Gastonia, its agents or employees.
- 8. DUPLICATE ORIGINALS: This Agreement shall be executed by the parties hereto in duplicate originals, each of which when executed shall constitute one and the same Agreement.
- 9. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This instrument contains the entire Agreement between the parties, and no statement, oral or written, made by any party or agent of any party that is not contained in this Agreement shall be valid or binding. This contract may not be enlarged, modified or altered, except in writing signed by the parties and endorsed hereon.
- 10. NON-APPROPRIATION: In the event funds are not appropriated during the term of this Agreement for the subject matter herein described, and there are no other available funds by or with which payment can be made to the Vendor, this agreement is terminated. This Agreement will be deemed terminated on the last day of the fiscal period for which appropriations were received without penalty or expense, except to the portion of payment for which funds have been appropriated and budgeted.
- 11. IRAN DIVESTMENT ACT CERTIFICATION REQUIRED BY N.C.G.S. 147-86.59(a). As of the date listed below, the vendor or bidder listed below is not listed on the Final Divestment List created by the State Treasurer pursuant to N.C.G.S. 147-86.58. The female jail population for February and March 2020 exceeded operational capacity. As a result, inmates were shipped to Cherokee County. Inmates were housed between 1-16 days. The total cost for February is \$6,280 and \$5,960 for March. The population decreased significantly in mid-March which allowed all inmates to be brought back March 15th. The Sheriff's Office does not have funds allocated for this expense. The jail expansion is expected to be online FY 20.
