

Electronic cigarettes, Juul and other vaping products are considered **"tobacco products"** by the NC General Assembly and the FDA



Dangers of Secondhand Aerosol



It is difficult for consumers to know what e-cigarette products contain. For example, some e-cigarettes marketed as containing zero percent nicotine have been found to contain nicotine.



E-cig/Vaping Dangers for Youth: Addiction

- Developing youth brains are more susceptible to addiction
- 63% of youth surveyed don't know that the most popular e-cigarette juice (JUUL) ALWAYS contains nicotine
- One JUUL cartridge has nicotine levels equal to a PACK of cigarettes



E-cig/Vaping Dangers for Youth: Marketing

- Intentional marketing towards kids
 - Flavors, claims of safety, "coolness," tech-oriented devices attract youth
