- WHEREAS, foster care is an invaluable resource for keeping children safe in temporary circumstances and providing stability, direction and comfort to one of our community's most vulnerable populations; and,
- WHEREAS, children in foster care are in the midst of crisis during a global pandemic. Social workers, foster parents, and dedicated community members work tirelessly to assure they receive safe, secure, and stable homes; and,
- WHEREAS, we honor the selfless individuals who open their homes to nurture and promote healing, unification, and family based empowerment and acknowledge the additional challenges imposed by the coronavirus; and,
- WHEREAS, dedicated individuals, families, professionals, and faith based and community organizations who support children in foster care help maintain essential parent-child relationships and support parents working to regain custody of their children; and,
- WHEREAS, dedicated child welfare professionals work to achieve permanency for children through reunification with birth parents, kinship care, adoption, or legal guardianship.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Gaston County Board of Commissioners hereby proclaims the month of May 2020 as
