The Gaston County Board of Commissioners (BOC) met in Regular Session on April 28, 2020 at 6:00 pm, in The Harley B. Gaston, Jr. Public Forum, Gaston County Courthouse.

Chairman Tracy L. Philbeck presided with Commissioners Bob Hovis, Tom Keigher and Ronnie Worley in attendance.

Commissioners Jack B. Brown, Vice-Chairman; Chad Brown and Allen R. Fraley were in attendance via telephone.

Others present included Dr. Kim S. Eagle, County Manager; Jonathan L. Sink, County Attorney; Charles L. Moore, Attorney; and Donna S. Buff, Clerk to the Board.

Chairman Philbeck advised that although tonight's meeting was closed to the public, the Board created a dedicated telephone line and email account to receive public comment until its meetings can be reopened for public attendance and any comments received prior to the submission deadline will be entered into the record of tonight's meeting.

Upon request of Chairman Philbeck, Commissioner Hovis led those assembled in the Invocation and Commissioner Worley led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Public Hearing - RE: Commissioner Philbeck - County Attorney - To Approve a Small Business Emergency Bridge Loan Program in Gaston County and Authorize the Appropriation of \$524,000 from Fund Balance</u>

Chairman Philbeck announced the Public Hearing as advertised; explained procedures to be used; called for the motion to enter into Public Hearing.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Worley and seconded by Commissioner Hovis, the BOC unanimously entered into Public Hearing.

Chairman Philbeck recognized the County Attorney for comments.

County Attorney Sink presented a Powerpoint presentation and advised that a brief video would follow. He noted the goal of the Small Business Bridge Loan Program is to help small businesses due to the financial and economic hardships being felt in the County and throughout the state and country; the program entails a \$523k appropriation from the BOC; \$500,000 will be direct loan awards capped at \$5,000 or less; the loans are not grants; the loan review committee would be authorized to issue amounts under \$5,000; the loans will be administered in house with County staff and will not be using a third-party lender (some municipalities are also using this format). He thanked staff for making the online application easy to use.

He advised that NCGS 158-7.1 provides the legal authority for this program. If the BOC is to vote to issue the money, it must impact one of six categories stipulated in the statute and staff has identified four that apply to Gaston County (population, taxable property, employment and business prospects); there is also an argument that the other two categories could apply (agricultural industries and industrial output). A public hearing is also enumerated in the statute.

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Another important requirement is the County must not compete with private banks; staff did its due diligence to make sure a 3% interest rate would not infringe on private banks; the loan agreement involves a 3-year term at 3% per year. Staff recommends 1) that the BOC allow an automatic one year deferment of any payments for the interest to accrue and for the 13th month to be their first payment with interest; 2) that they pay off the (unsecured) loan the remaining 24 months of the loan agreement.

He advised the eligibility criteria includes: the online application; businesses with 50 or fewer employees (no corporate or chain applicants); businesses must be established as doing business in the County prior to the state's declaration of a state of emergency (March 10); must be in compliance with applicable laws; must have no tax delinquencies in the last seven years; and, must be impacted from and by the COVID-19 health crisis.

He advised the online application is received by Finance staff and reviewed by the County Attorney for completeness; the Review and Selection Committee is comprised of five business and community leaders who has volunteered to meet on a weekly basis or more; once an application is selected the County Attorney will forward the awardees to Finance staff for physical checks. He yielded his comments for the presentation of a short video.

Following the video, Chairman Philbeck advised that no public comment was received and called for questions from the BOC.

Commissioner Worley cited a typographic error in the PowerPoint presentation and noted the slide should read "a business must be located in Gaston County prior to March 10, 2020" instead of 2010. He asked what recourse is available to the County for the unsecured loan other than tax liens in the event a business still goes under.

The County Attorney stated the County has a statutory obligation to pursue the debt reasonably; otherwise it becomes an effective grant which is only allowed in certain cases; there are a couple of options available for the County to pursue the debt.

Chairman Philbeck advised there are a lot of different criteria the County could have had; some businesses may not have a lot of assets to recover and many of them rent instead of own places; the County modeled this after the City of Belmont to make it easier for the businesses.

The County Attorney pointed out if the business is owned by a business entity, it is noted within the documents that a guarantor would have to sign.

Chairman Philbeck called for questions from Commissioners Fraley, Chad Brown and Jack Brown.

Commissioner Fraley asked if there were any time constraints on how long a business has been in operation.

The County Attorney responded the businesses will be required to show financials for the last two years.

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Chairman Philbeck advised that Commissioner Fraley brought this idea to the BOC and he will allow him to make the motion.

Commissioner Chad Brown asked if there was a maximum loan amount that businesses could request.

The County Attorney advised that the maximum loan amount is \$5,000.

Commissioner Jack Brown stated he had no questions.

Chairman Philbeck called for a motion to approve.

2020-088 Commissioner Philbeck - County Attorney - To Approve a Small Business Emergency Bridge Loan Program in Gaston County and Authorize the Appropriation of \$524,000 from Fund Balance

On motion introduced by Commissioner Fraley and seconded by Commissioner Hovis, the BOC unanimously approved Resolution **2020-088** as follows:

WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute §158-7.1 authorizes a County to undertake economic development projects by the appropriation and expenditure of funds to support private creation of jobs and tax base in the local jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, the public health emergency created by the novel coronavirus COVID-19 and the subsequent declarations of states of emergency by the Federal, State and local governments has caused serious harm to locally owned small businesses in Gaston County; and,

WHEREAS, due to the amount of time which has elapsed between Federal stimulus appropriations and the local availability of funds for small businesses, Gaston proposes to create a bridge loan fund for locally owned small businesses to help the businesses stay in operation while awaiting Federal stimulus funds; and,

WHEREAS, the Gaston County Board of Commissioners has held a public hearing to consider whether to approve the Small Business Bridge Loan Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Gaston County Board of Commissioners:

- 1. Has determined that this appropriation will increase the population, taxable property, employment and business prospects of the County.
- The County Manager is authorized and directed to implement the necessary documentation for applications and approval of loans to small locally owned businesses. Loans shall not exceed \$5,000 per business application. Terms of the loans shall be determined by the loan committee which shall be designated by the Manager.

The County Manager read comments from Ms. Cynthia Willis, Southern Charm Hair Design, 106 W. 1st St., Cherryville, NC, asking the BOC to urge our leaders (the Governor) to let small businesses open up their business.

Chairman Philbeck called for comments from the BOC.

Commissioner Keigher advised the BOC could forward the Governor a letter and ask him to revisit opening barbershops, beauty shops, nail salons licensed by the state that must adhere to state regulations.

Chairman Philbeck advised that the BOC fully supports Ms. Willis's right to open and operate her business with proper sanitation and hygiene. Because of the Governor's order, he recommended she reach out to the state board.

WHEREAS,	the U.S. Department of Transportation's ("USDOT") Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage
	Development Transportation Discretionary Grants Program ("BUILD") provides funding for capital
	investments in surface transportation infrastructure; and.

WHEREAS, the Lineberger Connector Project was identified as a regional project in the Franklin Boulevard Corridor Access and Alternative Development Mobility Strategy, completed in August 2016 by the City of Gastonia and the City of Lowell; and,

WHEREAS, the cities of Gastonia and Lowell, in partnership with Gaston County, seek to apply for grant funding to construct the Lineberger Connector Project, which will extend Aberdeen Boulevard east to connect to the existing Lineberger Road with improvements north to NC 7, and provide direct access to approximately 400 acres of property that is ripe for local and regional development; and,

WHEREAS, the cities of Gastonia and Lowell, in partnership with the property owner, are actively working with NorthPoint Development for the development of the Lineberger property; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed development will include over 4,675,000 s.f. of warehouse and wholesale sales, distribution, and storage operations; and,

WHEREAS, upon full buildout, NorthPoint Development is estimating a total of 2,571 new jobs; and,

WHEREAS, the property currently has only one access point via Lineberger Road, which is a substandard two-lane facility with an at-grade crossing of the Norfolk Southern rail corridor; and,

WHEREAS, in order for freight trucks to avoid this access, it is imperative that Aberdeen Boulevard be extended through the site to allow for a connection to Cox Road to the west, with safe and direct access to I-85: and.

WHEREAS, this proposed project presents a unique opportunity to provide accessibility to an area that could produce significant economic development and job creation along Interstate 85; and,

WHEREAS, the area in which the Lineberger Connector Project is located completely within a Federally designated Opportunity Zone, which could bring a much-needed infusion of investment dollars for economic development into the most distressed rural and urban areas of our state; and,

WHEREAS, the project will exemplify a strong public-private partnership involving multiple partners in both the public and private sectors, including collaboration among neighboring jurisdictions to achieve both

local and regional benefits, now.

This Agreement, made effective this the _____ day of _____, 2020, by and between the CITY OF GASTONIA, a North Carolina Municipal Corporation having a mailing address of PO Box 1748, Gastonia, NC 28053; CITY OF BELMONT, a North Carolina Municipal Corporation having a mailing address of PO Box 431, Belmont, NC 28012; TOWN OF CRAMERTON, a North Carolina Municipal Corporation having a mailing address of 155 N Main Street, Cramerton, NC 28032; and GASTON COUNTY, a body politic and a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina having a mailing address of PO Box 1578, Gastonia, NC 28053.

WITNESSETH:

THAT, WHEREAS, Article 20 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes of North Carolina authorizes any unit of local government and any one or more units of local government to enter into contracts or agreements with each other in order to execute any undertaking; and,

WHEREAS, Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act allows for the allocation of State Planning and Research (SPR) funds to be available for certain specified transportation activities; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia has requested federal funding for the Catawba Crossings Feasibility Study, hereinafter referred to as the Project, in Gaston County, North Carolina; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia has been designated as a recipient to receive funds allocated to the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) up to and not to exceed the maximum award amount of \$360,000 for the Project; and,

WHEREAS, NCDOT has allocated additional state funding, under State Bill 136-214, to provide a portion of the non-federal match, in the amount of \$67,500; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia has agreed to participate in certain costs and to assume certain responsibilities for project administration; and.

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia shall provide the non-federal match for the reimbursable amount, up to \$22,500 and an additional \$675 for SAP charges (cost incurred by NCDOT); and,

WHEREAS, the City of Gastonia has contracted with Gannett Fleming, Inc. to perform the necessary services to complete the Catawba Crossings Feasibility Study; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms, conditions and covenants hereinafter set forth, it is agreed between the parties hereto as follows:

- PURPOSE: The purpose of this agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions under which The City of Belmont, Town
 of Cramerton, and Gaston County will provide monies to the City of Gastonia for local match costs associated with the
 Catawba Crossings Feasibility Study.
- PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The City of Gastonia shall engage the services of Gannett Fleming, Inc. to develop a feasibility study to evaluate a potential crossing of the Catawba River, providing a third parallel highway crossing connecting Gaston and Mecklenburg Counties.
- 3. COSTS: The total Project cost is \$512,489 and includes federal funding, state and local matches. See funding table below:

Utilizing a per capita population breakdown of the total Non-Federal Local Match, the City of Belmont shall pay a 6.1% portion of the local match in the amount of \$4,400, the Town of Cramerton shall pay a 2.52% portion of the local match in the amount of \$1,819, and Gaston County shall pay a 47.98% portion of the local match in the amount of \$34,621. Local match portions shall be paid directly to the City of Gastonia. The City of Gastonia will be responsible for another 43.41% portion of the local match in the amount of \$31,324.

- 4. REIMBURSEMENT: The City of Gastonia will bill the City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County accompanied by appropriate documentation justifying the request for payment. The City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County will reimburse the City of Gastonia for costs within forty-five (45) days of receipt of the request.
- AGENCY: The City of Gastonia shall ensure the Project is completed within a reasonable time after the execution of this Agreement. This Agreement is not to establish any kind of joint agency or partnership agreement between the parties.
- ACCESS: The City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County retain the right to inspect documents, materials, papers and other related items at any point in the Project, with proper notification to the City of Gastonia.
- 7. INSURANCE AND INDEMNITY: The City of Gastonia shall at all times indemnify, save, protect, and keep harmless the City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County from all costs, loss, damage, liability, expense, penalty and fines which may arise from or be claimed against them by any person or persons, firms or corporations, for any injuries to persons or property, or damage for whatever kind or character consequent upon or arising from this Agreement by reason of any negligent act of the City of Gastonia, its agents or employees.
- 8. DUPLICATE ORIGINALS: This Agreement shall be executed by the parties hereto in duplicate originals, each of which when executed shall constitute one and the same Agreement.
- 9. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This instrument contains the entire Agreement between the parties, and no statement, oral or written, made by any party or agent of any party that is not contained in this Agreement shall be valid or binding. This contract may not be enlarged, modified or altered, except in writing signed by the parties and endorsed hereon.
- 10. NON-APPROPRIATION: In the event funds are not appropriated during the term of this Agreement for the subject matter herein described, and there are no other available funds by or with which payment can be made to the Vendor, this agreement is terminated. This Agreement will be deemed terminated on the last day of the fiscal period for which appropriations were received without penalty or expense, except to the portion of payment for which funds have been appropriated and budgeted.
