The Gaston County Board of Commissioners (BOC) met in Regular Session on June 22, 2021 at 6:00 p.m., in The Harley B. Gaston, Jr. Public Forum, Gaston County Courthouse.

Vice-Chairman Allen R. Fraley presided with Commissioners Chad Brown, Bob Hovis, Kim Johnson, Tracy L. Philbeck and Ronnie Worley in attendance.

Chairman Tom Keigher was not in attendance.

Others present included Dr. Kim S. Eagle, County Manager; Jonathan L. Sink, County Attorney; Donna S. Buff, Clerk to the Board.

Upon request of Vice-Chairman Fraley, Commissioner Hovis led those assembled in the Invocation and Commissioner Brown led in the Pledge of Allegiance. Preceding the prayer, Commissioner Hovis called for a Moment of Silence in memory of former Commissioner Donald (Don) Jerry Grant who passed away on June 16, 2021.

Public Hearing RE: Commissioner Keigher - Building & Development Services - Extraterritorial Jurisdiction Relinquishment: ETJ21-01 Gaston County Planning Board (Applicant); Property Parcels: (See Attached List), To Accept the Relinquished Land Area By the City of Lowell in its Extraterritorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) and Accept Zoning of Subject Area, From City of Lowell Municipal Zoning in Extraterritorial Jurisdiction to Gaston County Zoning Jurisdiction; To Either (RS-8), (RS-12), (RS-20), (RMF), (C-3) or (I-2) Zoning Districts, Which Are Similar Zoning Districts, with the Approved Changes Being Effective Thursday, July 1, 2021 at 12:01 A.M.

Vice-Chairman Fraley announced the Public Hearings as advertised; explained procedures to be used and called for the motion to enter into Public Hearings.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Brown and seconded by Commissioner Hovis, the BOC unanimously entered into Public Hearings.

Vice-Chairman Fraley recognized Mrs. Sarah Penley, Building and Development Services Senior Planner, for comments.

Mrs. Penley advised subject request is to accept and zone the City of Lowell's relinquished extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) into the County's zoning jurisdiction and recommended zoning districts; an ETJ is a designated area (typically a perimeter of one mile adjacent to a municipal boundary) that grants a municipality regulating ordinances within that designated perimeter. Examples of such ordinances includes zoning, subdivision, building codes and regulations, historic districts and landmarks, community development, erosion control, flood plains, etc. The City of Lowell adopted a Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) on May 11, 2021 and chose to relinquish all properties located within its ETJ.

The Planning Board reviewed this item on June 14, recommended approval by a unanimous vote, and submitted the application for the BOC's consideration; there are 194 parcels for a combined total of 372.76 acres; the locations are multiple and varied with numerous owners; the current uses are also multiple and varied; the City of Lowell, prior to adoption of its newest ordinance, had

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adopted a modified version of the County's UDO, therefore the zoning districts are identical and similar in description to the County's zoning districts; if approved, the zoning districts would not necessarily change, but would be regulated by County staff effective July 1, 2021.

She reviewed an overview map depicting the City of Lowell's zoning district areas 1, 2 and 3 and a map showing the County's matching zoning districts, if relinquished. The BOC received the maps and zoning district information in their Agenda packets for review.

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for citizen comment and for questions from the BOC; none were heard.

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for a motion to close the Public Hearing.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Philbeck and seconded by Commissioner Brown, the BOC unanimously closed the Public Hearing.

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for a motion to approve.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Worley and seconded by Commissioner Philbeck, the BOC unanimously approved **2021-174** as follows:

<u>Public Hearing RE: Commissioner Worley - Building & Development Services - To Approve Amendment to the Carolina Thread Trail Master Plan and Maps for Gaston County Communities, to Include the Blueway Trail</u>

COMMISSIONER'S COURT

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Vice-Chairman Fraley introduced Mrs. Cathy Hart, Parks and Recreation Director, for comments.

Mrs. Hart advised the Blueway plan was a joint project involving several staff members (Mr. Juan Garcia, Mr. Mike Applegate and Mrs. Hart) who worked on this for about a year at the request of the Carolina Thread Trail (CTT); currently only one other county in the 15 county region has a Blueway plan; Gaston will be the first to have a Blueway and a Greenway plan; staff met with municipalities having access to the river and gathered and incorporated their plans for future and current launch facilities into the map; Belmont, Cramerton, Mount Holly and Gaston County Parks & Recreation submitted letters of support for the project; Mount Holly's letter arrived late and may not be in BOC's packets. She stated it is good to have a plan and added she receives calls constantly about where people can access the river; it is important to provide public access areas from a Parks and Recreations perspective; Mr. Applegate may have comments about the tourism benefits. The Planning Board reviewed the plan and unanimously approved it on June 14.

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for questions.

Commissioner Philbeck asked if the plan involved any eminent domain; CTT and other parks and municipalities have used that option.

Mrs. Hart responded "no"; the locations on the map are currently used as access points or are future access points that were identified by the municipalities; there are no plans for any eminent domain.

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for additional questions from the BOC; hearing none, called for citizen comment.

Mr. Ashton Lamb, 209 Springs Garden Dr., Belmont, NC, and Community Coordinator for the CTT advised his colleague (Ms. Jane Love, Community Coordinator for the CTT) was present as well; thanked BOC and its staff for their support of the CTT and the proposed adoption of the Blueway to its Master Plan. The Catawba River, South Fork and other Blueways in the County provide a significant natural resource value as well as an economic and human value; he urged the BOC to support the addition of the Blueway into the Master Plan and congratulated the BOC for being the first to do so in addition to the CTT Master Plan.

Mr. Michael Applegate, Travel & Tourism (T&T) Director, advised via T&T's marketing that the County's hiking, biking and paddling trail systems are an important part of the County's promoted brand identity; T&T shared its strategic plan with the BOC almost two years ago that included the mission to optimize the County's brand experiences to drive visitation and partner economic growth; also laid out the vision to become the piedmont's premiere outdoor recreation destination; whether focused on targeted destination sales and marketing, impactful designation management, influential partnerships or effective organizational performance, the County's natural spaces and its convenient affordable access differentiate us from the competition along the I-85 and I-77 corridors. The CTT Master Plan Amendment also supports the County governments organizational strategic plan in areas of community health, safety and well-being, and it will ensure our Blueways are used responsibly, maximizing visitors enjoyment and protecting residents private property.

In terms of economic development and planned growth, the County has seen private businesses and non-profits such as Aquatic Adventures in Mount Holly, the Catawba Riverkeeper Foundation

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in McAdenville, relocate to the backs of Catawba River and South Fork Catawba River, offering new experiences that help the County to improve visitors' demands through those experiences.

Under recreation, cultural, life-long learning opportunities, updating the Master Plan lays out a long-term strategy to improve connectivity between recreational spaces and associated service, amenities and businesses, while balancing development with preservation in order to sustain our natural resources and drive future growth. He encouraged the BOC to accept and approve the Resolution on behalf of the T&T staff, its Advisory Board and the local hospitality industry.

Commissioner Brown advised that Commissioner Philbeck brought up a good point and asked if the BOC should add to the proposed Resolution that no eminent domain would be taken.

Commissioner Philbeck responded he would support that.

Commissioner Hovis advised the use of eminent domain by the County would require a separate action above and beyond the conversation of this particular map; the BOC would have to enter into that type of agreement to use eminent domain; do not think the statement is necessary.

Commissioner Brown stated if that is the case, he is good.

Commissioner Worley advised he has been associated with the CTT for about ten years since Cramerton designated part of the CTT throughout Goat Island Park; a number of entrepreneurs have started small businesses associated with the CTT; there are two canoe/kayak companies in Cramerton; there is an economic development component to expanding the CTT; he supports it and that is why he sponsored the Resolution.

Hearing no additional comments, Vice-Chairman Fraley called for a motion to close the Public Hearing.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Brown and seconded by Commissioner Hovis, the BOC unanimously closed the Public Hearing.

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for a motion to approve.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Worley and seconded by Commissioner Brown, the BOC unanimously approved **2021-175** as follows:

WHEREAS, On February 26, 2009, the Gaston County Parks and Recreation Commission and on February 26, 2009, the Gaston County Planning Board, voted to recommend adoption/approval of the "Carolina Thread Trail Plan for Gaston County Communities" to the Gaston County Board of Commission;

and

WHEREAS, a Resolution to support the Carolina Thread Trail was approved by the Board of County

Commission on March 26, 2009; and,

WHEREAS, the Carolina Thread Trail has submitted a map amendment to include the Blueway Trail, which includes existing connections along the South Fork River through the Towns of Spencer Mountain, McAdenville, and Cramerton; and, a segment continuing south from Mountain Island Lake along the Catawba River through the City of Mount Holly; with proposed connections along the South Fork River from the Town of Cramerton heading south to Lake Wylie; and, from along the Catawba River through and from the City of Belmont heading south to Lake Wylie; and, along Dutchman's

Creek heading south towards the City of Mount Holly; and,

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WHEREAS, the City of Belmont, Town of Cramerton, and Gaston County Parks and Recreation Department

offer written support of same; and,

WHEREAS, the Gaston County Planning Board voted to recommend adoption/approval of the Carolina Thread Trail Master Plan and Maps Amendment at their regularly scheduled meeting on June 14, 2021;


and,

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Public Hearing RE: Commissioner Keigher - County Attorney/EDC - To Approve a Gaston County Level Four Incentive Grant Pursuant to N.C. Gen Stat. §158-7.1 and to Authorize Gaston County to Enter into an Economic Development Agreement (EDA) with PROJECT HEARTH

Vice-Chairman Fraley introduced Mr. Donny Hicks, Economic Development Commission Director, for comments.

Mr. Hicks advised Project HEARTH anticipates investing roughly \$135M into a new facility and personal equipment; will create 128 jobs with an average salary of about \$36,515/year; want assurance that the County will follow through and deliver on the incentives; staff has a basic EDA (Economic Development Agreement) with NorthPoint and this will take care of the personal equipment.

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for citizen comment and for questions from the BOC; none were heard.

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for a motion to close the Public Hearing.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Philbeck and seconded by Commissioner Hovis, the BOC unanimously closed the Public Hearing.

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for a motion to approve.

On motion introduced by Commissioner Philbeck and seconded by Commissioner Hovis, the BOC unanimously approved **2021-176** as follows:

WHEREAS,	Project HEARTH is considering a total investment of \$135 million to establish a facility in Gaston County, to include the purchase and installation of machinery & equipment, with the expectation to complete this investment on or before December 31, 2022; and,
WHEREAS,	the firm intends to create at least 128 new jobs, within five years of establishing operations, expecting to pay an average annual wage of \$36,515; and,
WHEREAS,	North Carolina General Statute §158-7.1 authorizes a County to undertake an economic development project by providing grants for the location of industry; and,
WHEREAS,	Gaston County developed an economic grant policy to provide global advanced manufacturing

companies and distribution facilities with high quality industrial park locations; and,

WHEREAS,
the Gaston County Board of Commissioners finds that it is in the best interests of the County to provide a Level Four Economic Development Grant to Project HEARTH. It is anticipated that the

Company's capital investment in and at the Property and its operations thereat will generate significant ad valorem tax, sales tax and other revenues to the County; and,

WHEREAS, the County will prepare a detailed Economic Development Agreement (EDA), between Project HEARTH, the County and the City of Gastonia, so as to induce the company to provide good job opportunities and capital investment which will enhance the County's ability to attract additional business and industry.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Gaston County Board of Commissioners approves a Level Four Grant and authorizes the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or the County Manager to execute any documents necessary to complete an Economic Development Agreement for Project HEARTH.

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GASTON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

Commissioners Committee Reports

Commissioner Hovis reported that *CaroMont Health* completed the groundbreaking for its second site in Belmont; project is ahead of schedule; all the steel is in place for the four-story urgent care facility on Court Drive; CaroMont staff are doing a great job of moving things forward at a fast pace.

Commissioner Worley reported attendance to the **Gaston County Veteran's United States Armed Forces Pinning Ceremony** at Eastridge Mall along with Representative John A. Torbett, Senator Alexander (Lincoln County) and several other Council members; attended former **Commissioner Don Grant's funeral service** along with Chairman Keigher.

He advised the County is a co-Applicant for the Build Grant that will be awarded later this year; the City of Gastonia and City of Lowell are planning on sending representatives to meeting with the Secretary of Transportation and to lobby for the grant in July; the BOC has also been asked to send a representative; suggested Mr. Donny Hicks' attendance as well.

The County Manager advised the date is July 27th and that she had shared the same request with the Chairman earlier.

Vice-Chairman Fraley said it would be good for someone to attend and asked Mr. Hicks if he would be available.

Mr. Hicks replied he had a conflict.

County Manager's Report

The County Manager presented as follows:

• Re: School Bonds Issuance: The County was authorized to issue \$250M in 2018; the first issuance (\$60M) occurred in late 2018 which left a balance of \$190M to be issued; the original schedule is on target to issue a second issuance in the Spring of 2022, a third issuance in 2025 and the last issuance in 2028; staff is working with the Schools to determine the appropriate amount for Spring, 2022; will have performance indicators and a project list and will keep BOC updated on that progress; the remaining funds will be used for two new or replacement schools (specific schools to be determined), classroom additions and additional maintenance needs.

Commissioner Hovis advised he would like for staff to look at land banking; there are other needs that are imminent, but not necessarily part of the original scope of the \$250M package. Land banking will provide a strategic advantage as the County moves forward on the next set of school needs, and provides an opportunity to extend water and sewer, and other needed services.

Vice-Chairman Fraley noted agreement and advised that land continually increases in price.

Commissioner Brown shared with the Manager that the BOC has previously requested that the EDC Director be involved in any land acquisition by the Schools going forward.

Commissioner Hovis advised that the BOC would like a seat at the table when potential school sites are being reviewed and vetted.

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County Attorney's Report

The County Attorney recalled that the BOC had previously signed the statewide Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) regarding how opioid litigation settlement funds would be dispersed; advised the County is approaching the half-way point of that national litigation (35 out of 76 counties, have signed the MOA).

Other Matters

None.

Vice-Chairman Fraley announced the BOC voted tonight to reschedule the July 13th Work Session to July 20th and that Piedmont Lithium will be making their presentation.

Adjournment

Vice-Chairman Fraley called for a motion to adjourn the Regular Meeting.
